Important results/findings

Didactics in special teacher education has got attention through the PhD studies and project activities.

Short presentation of Ph.D. projects

The PhD candidates plan to submit their theses in 2012. All the projects are related to the needs for the education of children with disabilities/special needs as shown in the following working titles;

• Project 1: Teacher education for inclusion: Preparing teacher trainees in to develop their

competencies for fostering communicative interaction in inclusive classrooms in Uganda.

• Project 2: The effect of training teachers in phonemic awareness, on their knowledge of teaching

reading and to the children's reading competencies.

Project 3: Special needs teachers' education in Uganda. Experiences and perspectives from

teachers of the deaf.

Project 4: Hearing aids use in 'inclusive' classrooms: experiences of students and teachers in

tertiary institutions of learning

Sustainability/further activities

All the 5 Ugandan scholars have permanent employment places at Kyambogo University. The university now allocates some funds for research in various aspects relevant to the needs of the country.

Impact of the project

Faculty of Special Needs and Rehabilitation will now have the capacity to start their own Master's programme in special needs education.

The NUFU project was timely because the basic requirement for a lecturer at Kyambogo University is a PhD degree. Apart from being able to enhance the implementation of academic programs at the university, the 5PhD candidates will be expected to carry out research and to publish, as well as to support their colleagues in their own research work.
