The way forward

Formalize and professionalize administrative procedures / Have started but should focus more on upfront semester planning, updating learning outcomes and systematic evaluations (joint evaluation template in place)

Teaching activities

- Strive at balance between senior and early career researchers
- Ensure stronger cohesion in courses / Seminar leaders + lecture descriptions
- Revise methods course / design seminar / specialization (15+15 ECTS)
- Reconsider exam formats / Al / Replace written individual essay with oral hearing and portfolio reviews
- Explore more bridge-building educational activities across STS and innovation

- Invite alumni to speak about careers
- Strengthen the alumni network / LinkedIn

Student recruitment
