# 2/14 Need for improvement of the contact between PECOS programme administration and the students

By the student representatives

- The second year students request more frequent and effective communication between the administration and the students. When the Design seminar is completed and the students set off to write their thesis, many feel that they are left to themselves. How can we inform the students that the second year is different, and prepare them to work independently?
- When the programme administration provided an information meeting for the second year students in January 2014 only 5 students showed up. Yet, some of the students demand more frequent meetings. The programme council pointed to the apparently paradox of requesting more meetings in light of the poor attendance at the current offerings. It was stated that there was a general understanding in the student group that the meeting held in January would be void of any actual information in favor of a motivational speech.

# 3/14 Optional courses

- Few relevant courses in English. There are some courses provided by the Dept. of Political Science, but not a single history course. The History Department are working to enhance their offerings, and hopefully they will be able to offer one course in English in the Autumn semester of 2014.
