Ethical Guidelines

ISS upholds the principles of equity, diversity and gender equality. Nobody at ISS, neither students nor staff, shall be subjected to bullying, unwelcome sexual attention or sexual harassment.

Diversity

Students, teachers, and the staff of the ISS represent a broad range of diversity in regard to social, cultural, and professional backgrounds, nationality, ages, gender, and sexual orientation. Through our meetings with students, teachers and staff members, we are given the opportunity to widen the horizon of our personal world in many ways.

We belong to a world that is complex and influenced by tensions and conflicts. Our understanding of this world may vary greatly according to where we come from and what we have experienced. Our ability to listen to each other with respect and maintain patience with each other is of great importance for the quality of our being together.

Students who experience bullying or other forms of harassment are urged to report it to the Residential Managers at Rønningen dormitory or to the ISS Director immediately.

Guidelines for Safety

The work and study environment at the University of Oslo shall be safe and inclusive. Everyone has a responsibility to ensure freedom of expression and contribute to an academic culture where everyone is able to express themselves safely, regardless of e.g. age, gender, sexual orientation, ethnicity, or disability.

Norwegian legislation prohibits harassment at workplaces and educational institutions. Harassment is acts, or utterances that have the purpose or effect of being offensive, frightening, hostile, degrading or humiliating. Harassment and undue behavior occur in many different ways, such as bullying or sexual harassment.

Sexual harassment is any kind of unwanted sexual attention or acts that have the purpose or effect of being offensive, intimidating, hostile, degrading, humiliating or troublesome.

"Sexual attention" refers to attention of sexual nature or sexually explicit attention. Attention may be verbal, non-verbal or physical.

Sexual harassment may range from looks, comments and unwanted touch. Sending photos or videos with sexual content via text, telephone or internet may also be forms of sexual harassment.

In order for something to be classified as sexual harassment, the attention must be undesirable. This means that the attention is neither welcome nor reciprocated. In a case where sexual harassment may have occurred, the viewpoint of the person who has been subjected to harassment should be given the most weight when assessing whether or not the harassment was undesirable. The safety and well-being of our students is the primary concern of ISS and UiO. Students who experience sexual harassment or sexual assault are urged to seek advice at the Crisis Team at Legevakten, to contact the Residential Manager at Rønningen dormitory, to contact the Director of ISS, and to report the incident to the UiO Speak Up system. The University of Oslo also has notification routines and a Speak Up system for reporting matters of this nature. Read more here:

Security

Although Oslo and Norway are generally a safe and peaceful environment, we ask all students to be aware of their personal safety and the safety of their fellow students. Students who notice something that seems out of place or someone who behaves in a strange manner, are asked to report this immediately to the Residential Manager at the dormitory or to the ISS Office.

Students residing at Rønningen will be provided a key card that gives them access to their dorm building and individual room. Rønningen reception will be manned between 7.00 and 0.30 every day, with a night watch running in between.

Drugs, Drinking, and Smoking

In Norway, the possession and use of ecstasy, marijuana, cocaine, LSD, etc., is illegal. Enforcement is strict and visitors convicted of drug offenses first serve jail terms and then are deported. The ISS is unable to assist students who have trouble with the police due to drug offenses.

Driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs is illegal. First-time offenders receive a three-week jail sentence.

Norwegian law prohibits smoking in all public buildings. This includes everything from cinemas to municipal offices to railway stations, as well as the University of Oslo campus and dormitories. Do not expect to be reminded by signs. Furthermore, it is illegal to smoke in all restaurants, cafés and bars in Norway.

Theft & Shoplifting

All supermarkets and most stores have implemented effective safety measures against shoplifting. Visitors caught shoplifting are deported irrespective of the value of the stolen item. Again, the ISS is not in a position to assist ISS students who have been accused of this type of offense or any other type of theft.

Academic Guidelines

Class Attendance

Regular Attendance

The International Summer School takes place during six intensive weeks. Instruction is concentrated and based on active student participation, and daily attendance is expected in all courses.

Planned Absence

The student must inform the teacher in advance about any planned absence. This makes it possible to discuss how the student can independently work through material that is discussed in class in the student's absence. The teacher should note any arranged absences.

Unforeseen Absence

In case of unforeseen absence, e.g. due to illness, the student must inform the teacher as soon as possible. This type of absence will also be noted.

Examinations

Special Exam Accommodations

Students who need a specially adapted exam must submit the Request for Special Examination Form. You may apply for examination arrangements on the UiO website by following the link titled "special examination arrangements" at the bottom of your course description (or follow this direct link: www.uio.no/english/studies/examinations/special-arrangements). The deadline to apply for exam accommodations is July 17, but please apply as early as possible.

Students may apply for access to alternative exam resources or exam forms on the basis of chronic illness and/or special needs that create a marked disadvantage compared to other students in the exam situation. Mothers who are breastfeeding may apply for extra time to complete the exam.

You must include documentation from a doctor/expert on your disability, illness or special needs. The documentation must:

- contain information about how your difficulties affect the exam
- be applicable for the period for which you are applying for adaptation
- be in English or a Scandinavian language

Form of Examination

All courses have examinations, either in the form of a digital exam in Inspera (UiO's digital exam portal), a term paper/take home exam which also will be submitted through Inspera, or a presentation. You must use your UiO username and password to access Inspera. It is expected that every student familiarizes themselves with Inspera before the exam takes place.

Norwegian language courses also have oral examinations

Time and Place of Examination

The ISS examination schedule can be found on your course schedule online, posted at Rønningen Folkehøgskole, and on the FHSAPP.

All in-person school examinations will be held in University of Oslo's digital examination building, Silurveien 2. ISS will arrange buses to the examination venue for early morning exams. Buses will leave approximately 1-1.5 hours before the first exam begins. We will provide precise times closer to the exam dates. There will not be arranged buses from Silurveien back to Rønningen after the exam.

NORAIN students will receive information from their teachers regarding the oral exams.

Exam Results

Exam results will be available on Studentweb approximately three weeks after exams. Transcripts can be ordered by each student in Studentweb. Please note that exam results cannot be given by phone or email.

Transcripts will be withheld until all obligations are fulfilled for students who:

- still have payments due
- have not handed in academic documents or other documentation

required during the admission process

- have not returned borrowed books, etc.

Preparations

Read carefully through all information you have received on exams. You should carefully check the time of the exam. The evening before the exam, make sure you have packed everything you need:

- UiO ID Card and UiO username and password
- Permitted auxiliary material (Note: In the Norwegian exams no auxiliary materials are allowed!)

Examination Procedures

Meeting Time

Meet at your exam room no later than 45 minutes before the exam is scheduled to start.

Identification

During the entire exam your ID card must be placed clearly visible in front of you on your desk. Students who must reset their UiO account at the examination venue because they forgot their username and/or password are not entitled to additional time on their exam.

Placement of Bags, Jackets, Mobile Phones, and Smartwatches

When you enter the exam room and before sitting down, you must turn off your mobile phone and remove your smartwatch, put them in your bag and place all your personal belongings, including your jacket, in a designated area.

Note: Access to a mobile phone or smartwatch during the exam is considered cheating regardless of whether the phone/smartwatch is turned on/has been used or not. The only personal items you are permitted to have with you are your ID card, writing materials, auxiliary materials (if allowed, see below) and food and drink.

Auxiliary Materials

In Norwegian language examinations absolutely no auxiliary materials are allowed. In the non-language courses the teacher will inform students in advance if and/or what auxiliary materials are permitted during the exam (e.g. dictionaries). Please hand in all auxiliary material to the ISS office for inspection 3 days prior to the exam. You can collect the items you handed in at the exam venue before the exam begins.

Announcements

Before the exam starts a proctor will give the following information:

- The UiO ID card must be visible on the table in front of the candidate throughout the entire exam.
- A 6-digit password will be announced after your course code. It is important to write this down to get access to the exam.
- The length of the exam
- All scratch paper needs to be handed in before you leave the exam room.
- If you need to go to the toilet during the exam, you must raise your hand, and you will be escorted to the toilet. If several students are accompanied out at the same time, they are not allowed to talk to each other.
- Norwegian language exams: No auxiliary materials are allowed.
- Other exams: Auxiliary materials may be permitted to be used during the exam.
- Cheating or attempting to cheat (for example, students talking to each other during the exam, exchanging notes, or if students have in their possession books/notes/mobile phones/smart watches) will lead to expulsion from the examination and failing the exam. Cheating may also lead to the exclusion from the University of Oslo for up to 2 years.

Late Candidates

Candidates who arrive late for an exam do not receive extra time. If you arrive more than 30 minutes after the exam has begun, you will not be permitted to take the exam.

Teacher's Presence

Teachers may be present at the beginning of the exam and can answer any technical questions. No assistance with the exam may be given.

Cheating

Cheating or attempting to cheat will lead to expulsion from the examination and failing the exam.

Examples of cheating/attempting to cheat:

- Candidates speaking to each other during the exam.
- Candidates exchanging papers.
- The possession of books/notes/mobile phones/smartwatches.
- Access to a mobile phone or a smartwatch during the exam is considered cheating regardless of whether the phone/smartwatch is turned on/has been used or not.

Uses of Sources and Citations in Assignments and Exams

While preparing a written assignment, it is essential that you cite sources correctly. Using improperly cited material may likely be categorized as plagiarism.

Main Rules

Your assignment should be your own independent work, a result of your own learning and efforts.

You may use other people's material:

- as sources of information about your topic.
- to support and illustrate your line of reasoning.

You must cite the source if you obtain data, reasoning and arguments for literature, syllabus, lecture notes, web pages, other students' papers of your own previously submitted papers.

All sources should be specified in your assignment, both in the text and in the list of references. This also applies when referring to your own previous work.

Academic Integrity

Scientific arguments and claims should be open to testing and criticism. Correct use of sources and citations are elements in ensuring this.

ECTS Grading Scale

The grading system used at Norwegian universities and colleges is based on the ECTS (European Credit Transfer System). The grading scale consists of the following 6 letters:

- A* Excellent: Excellent performance, clearly outstanding. Shows a high degree of independence.
- B* Very good: Very good performance, above average. Shows a certain degree of independence.
- C* Good: average performance, satisfactory in most areas.
- D* Fair: Performance below average, and with some significant shortcomings. The lowest grade with which you can receive a passing grade.
- E* Sufficient: Performance that meets the minimum criteria.
- F* Fail: Performance that does not meet the minimum criteria.

Pass/Fail Courses

NORA0110IN and NORA0120IN are both graded as pass/fail and cannot receive a letter grade. Bear this in mind when having credits transferred to your home university.

Credits

Credits from all ISS courses can be used towards a degree at the University of Oslo. Up to 40 ISS credits can be used as elective credits or as credits in approved programs at the UiO.

Explanation and Appeal

Explanation of Grade

A candidate may request an explanation of the grade within one week for written exams and within one day for oral exams after the grade has been published on Studentweb. Explanations of written and oral exam grades must be requested on Studentweb after results are published.

Appeal

You can submit an appeal against your grades for all written examinations. You cannot submit an appeal against the grades of oral examinations.

The deadline for appeals is three weeks after results are published in Studentweb. If the candidate has asked for an explanation they can appeal within three weeks after the explanation has been received. A new committee will evaluate the written examination. See the online course description for information on how to appeal.

Exam Results and Transcripts in Studentweb

ISS students can use Studentweb to do **two** things: see exam results and order transcripts. **Ignore any messages** about paying the autumn semester fee and registering for courses/exams. The autumn semester fee does not apply to ISS students during the summer. ISS students **CANNOT** register for courses or exams in Studentweb. The ISS office has already done this for you. Log on to Studentweb by using your UiO username and password: <https://studentweb.uio.no>

To See Your Exam Results: Click on *Results* in the top menu.

To Order Transcripts:

1. You can order a digital transcript in Studentweb, Click on *More...* in the top menu, choose *Orders* choose Digital transcript and click on *Order*
2. You will find the transcript under Documents in Studentweb after approximately 10 minutes.
3. The transcript is normally valid for several years, or until the certificate expires.

For North American Students:

1. Email iss@stolaf.edu and provide a physical mailing address where the transcript can be sent (digital transcripts are not available)
2. Your transcript will be sent via regular postage as soon as it is printed.

Cultural and Social Events

UiO ID/Key Card

As an ID Card

Your UiO ID card serves to identify you as an ISS student at the university and other relevant authorities (e.g. health services, sports facilities). In addition, the card functions as a library card and key card.

Please carry your ID card with you at all times and be careful not to lose it! The card is personal and must never be lent to someone else. If you lose your card, you are responsible for getting a new one.

Card access is valid only in the period June 22 – August 3, 2024.

As a Key Card

The doors to most of the buildings at the University are locked during the summer. Your ID card and pin-code gives you access to relevant buildings. You have access until 22:30 so that you can attend late afternoon and evening events on campus organized by the ISS. Sometimes you will need to use your pin-code.

All campus buildings lock at 22:30! You will not be able to enter or exit the buildings, even with your ID card.

After 22:30

In the event you find yourself locked in a building, **REMAIN CALM**. First, try the door openers; they look like a white light switch and are typically placed on the wall next to the door. If you cannot locate the door opener, try using your card. Some buildings require a key card to exit the building. If you are still unable to open the door, wait at the door until another person with a valid key card leaves the building or call the Security Office for help: **22 85 50 07** (serviced around the clock).

University Libraries

As an ISS student, you will have access to the University libraries that are open throughout the summer, which include the Medical, Law and Science Libraries. Some libraries may have extended opening hours when using a UiO student card and code. The Humanities and Social Sciences Library (HumSam) in Georg Sverdrups hus is the University's largest research library facility. The library offers a variety of study and work spaces, which all ISS students are welcome to use.

The library is open, but due to the academic calendar, the library has limited opening hours during the summer.

Sports

Students staying at ISS housing are welcome to use the sports facilities available at Rønningen.

ISS students can also join the Student Athletic Association (SiO Athletica, www.sio.no/en/sports) that offers a varied summer program (for a fee). Some of them have reduced opening hours/are closed during the summer, please see the website for information about activities, opening hours and availability.

Prices

Facilities at Rønningen are included with ISS housing. All activities at SiO Sports require an entrance pass for the summer or a single entrance ticket. Show your UiO ID card when you buy a membership or pass. Check out www.sio.no/en/sports for more information.

Facilities on Blindern Campus

Blindern campus provides its own range of amenities for students, including the Akademika bookstore, the Vitus pharmacy, the KAN hairdressers, and the Bunnpris grocery store (with a post office inside). Please check for shortened summer hours before visiting.

Health Care

Non-Housing Students

Students who reside permanently in Oslo should continue to seek health care through their regular health provider (i.e. regular GP/fastlege and legevakten).

Non-housing students who live in Oslo just for the summer, should contact the Residential Manager at Rønningen Folkehøgskole first for non-emergency medical treatment. They are the administrative liaison between the University Health Services & ISS students.

When in need of immediate medical care due to an acute crisis situation (e.g. strong pain in the chest, breathing difficulties, unconsciousness), see the “**In Case of Emergency**” section.

ISS-Housing Students

Students who stay at Rønningen Folkehøgskole should consult the Residential Manager in cases of illness or injury. They provide first aid and standard medication (antiseptic lotion, band aids, non-prescription medicine, etc.) and will, where medical attention is required, make appointments at the Student Health Services or the Emergency Health Center downtown.

Please be aware that it is quite common for ISS students to suffer sore throats and colds due to the change of climate, or aches and pains in muscles and joints due to excess physical activity. Whereas in some cultures with such symptoms one would visit a doctor, this is normally not the case in Norway; these conditions are rarely serious and can be alleviated through standard medication and sufficient rest.

In Case of Emergency

If you are present in a situation where another ISS student gets injured or experiences an acute illness, you should do the following:

If a representative of the ISS (teacher or staff) is present or can be called upon immediately, leave it to that person to handle the situation and follow instructions.

If there is no representative of the ISS present or immediately to be called upon, stay calm and:

Provide First Aid

- Secure the area.
- Prevent worsening of the injury or illness. An unconscious person should be brought into a stable side position to prevent choking.
- Establish contact with the injured or ill person.

Public Transportation

There is no discount on public transportation tickets for international students who are not regular students at a school in Oslo; **however, students with ISS housing will be provided a travel pass as a part of their Room & Board fees.** Period tickets, Pay-as-you-go credit and single tickets can be purchased at 7-11 stores, Deli de Luca stores, Narvesen stores, or at automated ticket machines at select stations. On the metro you are required to purchase and to validate your ticket **before** boarding the train.

Monthly, Weekly, and Daily Tickets

The best way to get around Oslo by public transport is with a ticket for unlimited travel (within zone 1). The tickets are valid for travel on local ferries (except the Bygdøy ferries), bus, tram, metro services and on Vy local trains within city limits. You must validate your card on the first ride!

Getting to Blindern Campus

Via T-Bane/Metro: Lines 4 & 5 stop at Blindern Campus at stop Blindern. If you are coming from the city center, you will take the

westbound line – 4 Vestli via Majorstuen, 5 Ringen via Majorstuen or 5 Sognsvann – to the stop, Blindern.

Via Trikk/Tram: Routes 17 and 18 stop at Blindern Campus stop, Universitetet Blindern. If you are coming from the city center, lines 17 Rikshospitalet and 18 Rikshospitalet to the stop, Universitetet Blindern.

Other Routes: You can also plan your route to Blindern Campus using the Ruter website/App.

Students staying with ISS housing can have incoming mail sent to Rønningen Folkehøgskole. Non-ISS housing students should have mail sent to their private addresses. Please note that international postage delivery may take considerable time and mail sent late in the program may not arrive before the program finishes.

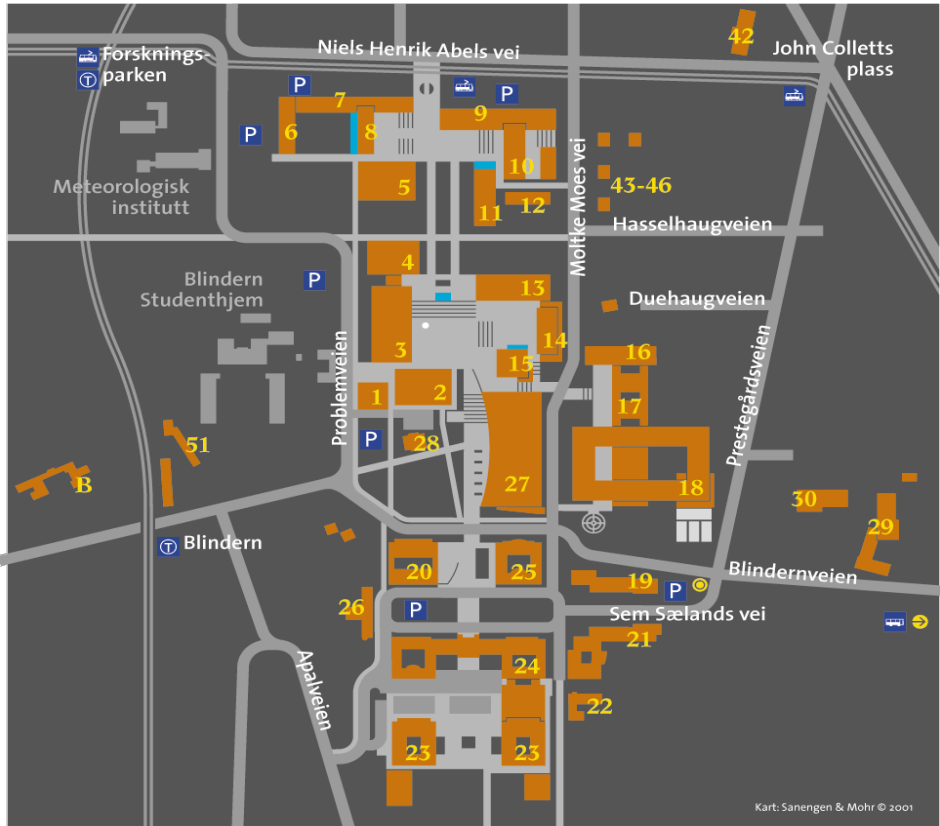
