

Problem

Politicians did in the past, do currently, and might in the future, challenge the rule of law and judicial independence and thus put political demands on the judiciary. Courts in different countries face forces calling for illiberal measures and 'reforming' the judiciary. Academia does critically assess the measures by which rulers in different regimes seek to influence judges improperly.

But it is equally important to explore judicial individual and collective reactions to rule of law backsliding. Is there a right, or even a duty of a judge to resist illiberal measures that limit the rule of law standards, including judicial independence, even if framed within positive law? Join us to explore these issues, based on real examples.
