You are to answer one of the following three questions.

The quality of your answer is more important than quantity. A length of between 8 and 10 pages at font 12 and with 1.5 line-spacing should be sufficient. Please hand in 3 copies of your answer.

- There has been a tendency in the Green movement to place the main responsibility for amelioration of consumption-related environmental problems on individuals and households. Do you agree with this? Support your answer with reflections around the conceptualisation of consumption and change.
- 2) What are the most significant differences in theoretical approaches to consumption in neo-liberal economics on the one hand, and the non-economic social sciences on the other? Discuss the strengths and weaknesses of economic-based and sociology/anthropology-based approaches as bases for policies to encourage sustainable consumption.
- 3) Using Bourdieu's notion of habitus, articulate a theory of the ways in which the movement of global ideas, people and commodities affects consumption practices in either Norway, India or in your country of origin.
