In The Media Welfare State Syvertsen, Enli, Mjøs and Moe argue that: «The public service broadcasting corporations of the Nordic countries can in many ways be seen as cornerstones of the Media Welfare State.» (2014, 71). However, digitalization poses several challenges for the public service broadcasters

in the Nordic countries, including what Lund and Lowe call «the interplay of traditional and online media»:

Despite increasingly sharp competition with radio and television operators, the newspaper industry was more cordial because broadcasting wasn't a direct competitor for them. This changed in the past decade as companies in all media sectors and industries invested in online media, and as newspaper companies bought or built TV channels (Flink 2011). Since



2008, an already fraying relationship has been exacerbated by the consequences of the economic recession. (2013, 54)

Assess and discuss the challenges digitalization poses to the Nordic media system based on the above statements and readings from the syllabus.
