- 4. What does Williamson mean by 'model building' and what does he think its role is in philosophy?
- C. Answer one of these questions (i.e., either 5 or 6, not both):
- 5. Why isn't there more progress in philosophy?
- 6. What is a verbal dispute and how can an account of verbal disputes help us do philosophy?
- D. Answer one of these questions (i.e., either 7 or 8, not both):
- 7. What is conceptual engineering and what role can it play in philosophy?
- 8. Outline some ways in which feminist philosophy has influenced philosophical methodology.
