Answer one (1) of the three (3) questions below:

1. Ronald Dworkin has argued:

Free speech is a basis for legitimate government. Laws and policies are not legitimate unless they have been adopted through a democratic process, and a process is not democratic if government has prevented anyone from expressing his convictions about what those laws and policies should be.

Discuss this statement.

- 2. In an interview with a Norwegian newspaper recently the British philosopher Quentin Skinner argued that in today's society freedom of expression is not a right that is equal to everyone, Owners of large media corporations have the opportunity to have their opinions heard in a manner that is not equal to the ordinary citizen. Discuss this in relation to the basic principles underlying the principles of freedom of expression.
- **3.** Discuss the relationship between freedom of expression and freedom of the press.
