HUMR 5702 - Human Rights and Development *Take Home Exam No. 1*

You are an advisor at the Centre for Global Development. You are asked to provide a briefing paper on emerging proposals for the post-2015 agenda (Maximum 3500 words). Specifically, you are asked to analyse **ONE** of the following proposals in the Annex of the *Report of the High Level Panel of Eminent Persons on the Post-2015 Development Agenda* (pp. 30-31):

- 1c. Cover x% of people who are poor and vulnerable with social protection systems.
- 2a. Prevent and eliminate all forms of violence against girls and women.
- 3c. Ensure every child, regardless of circumstance, has access to lower secondary education and increase the proportion of adolescents who achieve recognised and measurable learning outcomes to x%.
- 4d. Ensure universal sexual and reproductive health and rights.
- 5e. Reduce postharvest loss and food waste by x%.
- 7b. Ensure universal access to modern energy services.
- 8a. Increase the number of good and decent jobs and livelihoods by x.
- 10b. Ensure people enjoy freedom of speech, association, peaceful protest and access to independent media and information.
- 11a. Reduce violent deaths per 100,000 by x and eliminate all forms of violence against children.
- 12c. Hold the increase in global average temperature below 2^0 C above pre-industrial levels, in line with international agreements.

Your briefing paper should:

- Analyse the arguments for and against the proposal. This should include human rights perspectives and considerations from the different disciplines in the course (normative theory, law, social sciences).
- Analyse how the target should be best constructed so as to meet normative, legal and policy demands together with any likely political or economic objections.
- Consider what indicators could be used to measure the target and any issues in that regard.

Additional Instructions

- 1. It is expected that you will need to use materials in and beyond the course pensum.
- 2. Please use the author-date method for referencing secondary literature. This requires a simple author-date citation in the main text (with any relevant page number) and the full citation in a bibliography. This is the method used in the main course book: *The MDGS and Human Rights* (CUP, 2013). The bibliography is not included in the word limit.
- 3. Please follow the standard Faculty Guidelines for referencing case law. Full references are not needed for treaties. Case law and treaties should be referenced in the footnotes.
- 4. Footnotes should otherwise be used sparingly. Use them for clarification purposes for example.
