**KRIM 2953 Criminological Perspectives on Gender, Sexuality and Violence**

Several scholars on your reading list (e.g., Walklate, Smart, Carline and Engle) discuss if, how and to what extent law is a useful response to sexual/ized violence and gendered social problems. Account for assumptions about law that drive legal optimism in this area, as well as the arguments that challenge it.

**Size:** **Maximum 2400 words** (roughly 6 pages). Front page, contents page (optional) and bibliography are not included. If footnotes are used in the text (at the bottom of each page), they are included in the 2400 word limit. **Papers that exceed the 2400 word limit will be disallowed.**

**Cheating:** Any exam at the University of Oslo is being checked for both correct word count and incidents of cheating. The text recognition software Ephorus will be used to find cases of plagiarism. Failure to cite sources or highlight quotes in any assignments that are handed in is considered cheating.
