

Krim4953 - Criminological perspectives on gender, sexuality and violence

Choose one of the following two assignments:

A. *Violence committed by a family member is often termed 'domestic violence', and in many jurisdictions, such acts are criminalized by separate acts. Describe and discuss arguments for and against defining such crimes as separate from violence committed in other relations.*

B. *In 2015, Amnesty International adopted a new policy on prostitution wherein they advise governments around the world to decriminalize all aspects of adult consensual prostitution in order to protect the human rights of people who sell sex. Use course literature on legal strategies and prostitution to discuss arguments for and against decriminalization of prostitution.*

Size: Maximum 4000 words (roughly 10 pages). Front page, contents page (optional) and bibliography are not included. If footnotes are used in the text (at the bottom of each page), they are included in the 4000 word limit. **Papers that exceed the 4000 word limit will be disallowed.**

Cheating: Any exam at the University of Oslo is being checked for both correct word count and incidents of cheating. The text recognition software Ephorus will be used to find cases of plagiarism. Failure to cite sources or highlight quotes in any assignments that are handed in is considered cheating.

Submit your exam: The essays shall be handed in electronically in Inspera. Exams at the University of Oslo are anonymous. Instead of your name, write your four-digit candidate number found in StudentWeb.
