The Statped library is a library designed to cater to people in various stages of education with varying degrees of learning disabilities. From what we saw when we visited , they have a good collection of various material for teachers on how to teach and help people with these disabilities. Currently they are working on developing a special e-book service for their users, where they are planning to make use of the e-book provider ProQuest.

Lilly Arstad Helmersen: Have no problem talking to people and good at doing interviews. Also have experience in making interview guides, to get the information we need. Why did we choose this project?

We initially wanted to do a different project, but all our choices had already been picked. After going through the remaining projects this one stood out to us because they didn't specify a product they wanted us to develop, but rather wanted ideas on how to make their

services more universal accessible for their users and what they should prioritize and we thought this would fit well with the theme of the course. After a meeting with them we have more or less decided to pursue the e-books part of the project as this seemed like something they really wanted us to do and their users had specific issues with, and they were eager to let us access their resources within this field for testing purposes, like a test user for ProQuest.

The project proposal states that this project is about library development using design thinking, but we haven't fully decided on a methodology for the project yet, but on Tuesday 12.09 we are attending a workshop at the Statped library where we will work with e-books and identify problems and after this we will decide on a methodology. Later on we will also talk with relevant users to find out more about what their needs are. We will attempt to have at least one meeting every week, and generally keep in touch through Slack.
