The reflection note should be between 1000 and 1500 words, and it should be on a topic that's related to your group presentation. In other words, you can choose to focus on a specific aspect or perspective of your presentation topic (rather than the entire broad topic). Importantly, the reflection note should not be just a summary of the presentation (or a particular study); rather, it should demonstrate your ability for critical reflection, and illustrate your understanding of the relevant phenomena/processes, gaps in current knowledge, and/or methodological limitations. The use of references is recommended where appropriate.
