ANTH4020 Academic Writing and Project Development Autumn 2022

The research proposal must be uploaded as a **pdf file** in Inspera before the announced deadline.

The research proposal should outline the background for the project, your research questions and how you plan to go about conducting the research.

The research proposal should contain the following elements:

- Background
- Research questions, place/empirical field
- Relevant literature and previous research within the field (remember to reference correctly and list all references in the reference list)
- Methods
- Ethical issues
- Project timeline
- Reference list

Word limit of research proposal: 3150-3850 words (excluding references).

Exams at the University of Oslo may be checked for correct word count. Research proposal which do not meet the requirement will not be graded.

You may submit your research proposal in English, Norwegian, Swedish or Danish.

Research proposal must:

- Have numbered pages.
- Have a font size and line spacing which makes it easy to read, for example font size 12, with 1,5 line break.
- Have a front page which specifies:
 - Total number of words
 - The course code and title
 - Semester and year
 - Your candidate number. Do **NOT** write your name in your research proposal. You find your candidate number in Studentweb.
