Exam ANTH4030 (final submissions):

You are to submit in **one** pdf file:

- 1. Three (3) of your reflection papers combined into one document (1500-2000 words including list of references). You can choose which three reflection papers you would like to resubmit. This document should have an introduction that explains why you have chosen these three reflection papers, followed by the three reflection papers and a final conclusion, as well as a list of references.
- 2. Include the 300-words blurb you wrote for the exhibit and a picture or a link of/to your creative project. These 300 words are not included in the word limit of your reflection papers, they are in addition to them.

The exam paper must be uploaded as a pdf file in Inspera before the announced deadline.

You must submit your exam in English.

Exam papers must:

- Have numbered pages.
- Have a font size and line spacing which makes it easy to read.
- Have a front page which specifies:
 - Total number of words
 - The course code and title
 - Semester and year
 - Your candidate number. Do **NOT** write your name in your exam paper. You find your candidate number in Studentweb.
