You are to submit in **one** PDF file: three short and revised reflection papers on individual lecture content in three separate weeks of the course. The file must be uploaded in Inspera before the announced deadline.

Word limit

Each reflection papers must be minimum 200 and maximum 500 words.

Exams at the University of Oslo may be checked for correct word count. Papers which do not meet the requirement will not be graded.

Language

You may submit your response in English, Norwegian, Swedish or Danish.

Exam papers must:

- Have numbered pages.
- Have a font size and line spacing which makes it easy to read.
- Have a front page which specifies:
 - Total number of words for each text
 - The course code and title
 - Semester and year
 - Your candidate number. Do **NOT** write your name in your exam paper. You find your candidate number in Studentweb.
- Be uploaded as **one** PDF file in Inspera.
