

Assessment Guidelines

ANTH4620 – Finance, Markets and Resources, Spring Semester 2023

About the course

The course covers a number of key theoretical issues concerning financialisation, and the making of markets, including morality and financialisation; the changing nature of the corporation; the construction, conversion and consumption of resources, and the role of new financial technologies. The students had to hand eight short reflection papers (c. 300 words each) relating to topics covered in separate weeks of the course in order to qualify for the examination.

About the exam

For the final examination, students were to submit revised versions of three reflection papers of their own choice.

Grading

This is a pass/fail course. A paper is passed if it summarises key arguments from 3 sections of the course. The paper will pass if it shows anything from an exceptionally high down to an acceptable level of understanding as laid out in the general guidelines for marking in Social Anthropology at Oslo University: https://www.uio.no/english/studies/examinations/grades/grade_descriptions/guidelines-for-grades-social-anthropology.pdf.pdf

A paper fails if it does not reach these requirements or if other mandatory elements of continuous assessment have failed to be satisfied
