Assignment requirements:

- The exam paper must be minimum 2 500 words and maximum 3 500 words including cover page and foot- or endnotes. Reference list is not to be included in the total number of words.
- Exam papers which do not meet the requirement for the minimum number of words or which exceed the maximum number of words will not be graded.
- Times New Roman, font size 12, line spacing 1,5
- Have numbered pages.
- Have a cover page which specifies:
 - Total number of words
 - The course code and title
 - Which question you have chosen to answer
 - Semester and year
 - Your candidate number. **Do not write your name in your exam paper.** You will find your candidate number in studentweb
- You may write your examination paper in Norwegian, Swedish, Danish or English.
- Make sure your submission is anonymous - do not use your name in your assignment or in the file name
- You are only allowed to submit one file and it needs to be in **PDF-format**.

Notes for all questions:

You must use at least 3 texts from the reading list. You are welcome and encouraged to use more. You can draw on other readings and sources to make your paper stronger, but with at least the stipulated number of reading list texts. Discussion questions require that you have a viewpoint that you argue well for and balance against other possible positions. Feel free to write creatively, expressing informed opinion. Remember to place texts in relation to each other.

Exam Questions:

Answer **one (1)** of the following three questions:

1. Many economic anthropologists as well as theorists of political economy agree with the statement that labour is the main source of value, and indeed that labour is found even in things where it is not obvious. What does this statement mean?
2. For anthropologists, markets are historical and socio-cultural constructs, rather than an outcome of human nature. Indeed, anthropologists aim at denaturalising our understanding of markets and exchange. Discuss with examples.
3. Anthropology often complicates the conceptual divisions that people take for granted – for example the division between production and consumption, work and home, or gifts and commodities. Discuss with examples.
