Exam regulations for the take home exam Autumn 2019

Exam paper length:

The exam paper must be minimum 2 900 words and maximum 4 400 words including cover page and foot- or endnotes. The list of works cited may not exceed 1 page and is not to be included in the total number of words.

Exams at the University of Oslo may be checked for correct word count. Exam papers which do not meet the requirement for the minimum number of words or which exceed the maximum number of words will not be graded.

You may submit your response in English, Norwegian, Swedish or Danish.

Exam papers must:

- Have numbered pages
- Have a font size and line spacing which makes it easy to read
- Have a cover page which specifies:
 - Total number of words
 - The course code and title
 - Which question you have chosen to answer
 - Semester and year
 - Your candidate number in the upper right-hand corner. Do **NOT** write your name in your exam paper. You find your candidate number in the StudentWeb.
- Be uploaded as a **pdf file** in Inpera before the announced deadline.
