

Exam regulations for take home exam - bachelor students

	Take home exam
	Time frame: the number of days/weeks from the day the essay is assigned to the
SOSANT2xxx	due date will vary from course to course and from semester to semester.
Advanced bachelor	Essay length: minimum requirement 2,900 words – maximum length 4,400
course:	words (including cover page and foot- or endnotes). The list of works cited may
	not exceed 1 page and is not to be included in the total number of words.

General guidelines for take home exams:

Exam papers must:

- Be type-written
- Have numbered pages
- Have a font size and line spacing which makes it easy to read
- Have a cover page which specifies:
 - Total number of words
 - o The course code and title
 - o Which question you have chosen to answer
 - Semester and year
 - O Your candidate number in the upper right-hand corner. Do **NOT** write your name on your exam paper! You find your candidate number in the StudentWeb.

You must hand in **three copies** of your exam paper which meet the requirements specified above.

Every copy of your exam paper must be **stapled** together.

One signed copy of the "Declaration of sources" must be handed in together with your exam paper. Do not attach this declaration to your paper. Exam papers which do not meet the requirement for the minimum number of words or which exceed the maximum number of words will not be accepted or returned later without assessment or grading.

Exams at the University of Oslo may be checked for correct word count and incidents of cheating. The text recognition software Ephorus could be used to find cases of plagiarism.

The exam essay must be written in accordance with University regulations. Exam papers not written in accordance with University regulations may be subject to charges of cheating.
