Exam paper length: minimum requirement 2 900 words – maximum length 4 400 words including cover page and foot- or endnotes. The list of works cited may not exceed 1 page and is not to be included in the total number of words.

Exam papers which do not meet the requirement for the minimum number of words or which exceed the maximum number of words will not be accepted or returned later without assessment or grading.

Exams at the University of Oslo may be checked for correct word count and incidents of cheating. The text recognition software Ephorus could be used to find cases of plagiarism.

ENGLISH:

Answer one of the following three questions:

- 'Biomedicine is, like all sciences, universal and mobile; traditional medicine is locally specific and place bound'. Discuss and critique this idea drawing on ethnographic evidence, using more than three texts from the reading list.
- 2. Discuss how authors on the reading list approach 'social suffering'. Place a particular emphasis on the relation between pain and voice. Use several ethnographic examples and more than three texts in the argument.
- 3. Discuss, drawing upon at least three texts from the reading list (and other examples), how biomedicine has evolved in close relation to the nation state, and how globalisation has affected and changed this relationship between biomedical practices and larger collective(s).
