Exam paper length: minimum requirement 2 900 words – maximum length 4 400 words including cover page and foot- or endnotes. The list of works cited may not exceed 1 page and is not to be included in the total number of words.

Exam papers which do not meet the requirement for the minimum number of words or which exceed the maximum number of words will not be accepted or returned later without assessment or grading.

Exams at the University of Oslo may be checked for correct word count and incidents of cheating. The text recognition software Ephorus could be used to find cases of plagiarism.

ENGLISH:

Answer <u>one</u> of the following three questions:

- 'Citizenship' attachment to larger social collectives, including claims and obligations is tied in
 with biomedical practices. Discuss, using the reading list (e.g. Petryna, Fairhead, Hayden, Das,
 Redfield) and other examples, how biomedicine both depends on and produces different groups and
 different kinds of citizenship in diverse contexts and times.
- 2. Several texts on the curriculum deal with experiences of suffering and disease. Discuss the connection between suffering as embodied experience and the issue of voice. Use several ethnographic examples and utilize at least three texts from the reading list in your argument.
- 3. Following Foucault, diagnostic closure is considered a mark of biomedicine and source of its effectiveness. Discuss, drawing on the reading list (e.g. Street, Petryna, Geissler and Prince) how on the contrary openness and ambiguity (in bio- and other medicine) serve to open up pathways to action.
