

Directions for examiners REDI4001 Religion and Migration

The exam for this course is a term paper. The classes are arranged with the term paper as starting point and goal, so the students are expected to work actively with the term paper throughout the term. The assignment is given to the students in the first class. The classes are organised to identify cases from the curriculum and address the central topics in the course in order of priority and emphasis in the term paper.

It is a mandatory assignment for the students to submit a first draft of the term paper around 1/3 into the semester. One entire class will then be used to work on these drafts. The students will also receive written feedback from the teachers.

The term paper assignment

Present a case (or two) from the syllabus that includes the role of religion from theoretical perspectives. Interpret and discuss in which ways this case might contribute to new positions of citizenship.

Instructions for the examiner:

The aim is not for the student to discuss the cases, but to reflectively discuss how the cases contribute to new discussions in what (performative) citizenship may be about in the framework of the intersection religion/migration.
